Preserving Our Past, Inspiring Our Future

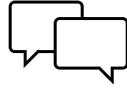

We also:

- Catalogue and digitise materials to ensure long-term access.
- Curate exhibitions and displays in the KKMC Heritage Gallery.
- Host events and talks that share KKMC's history with members and the wider community.

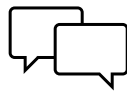

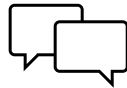

Family Life

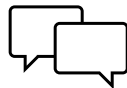
About Family Life Ministry

It provides courses like Marriage Preparation for building strong foundations and the Alpha Marriage Course (AMC) to help married couples invest in, enrich, and build up their relationships.

The ministry also offers parenting seminars and group events to equip parents with a biblical perspective on raising children, focusing on imparting a spiritual culture and developing character.

The heart of the ministry is to see marriages revived and strengthened, and to encourage families to be God-centered.

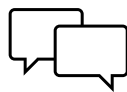

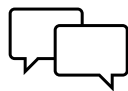
About LifeGroup Ministry

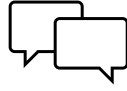

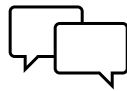

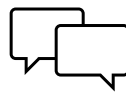

About Prayer Ministry

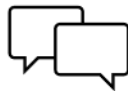
"Some trust in chariots and others in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God." (Psalm 20:7)

3. Seniors Corner Bible lesson

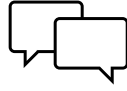
Takes place once a month

Seniors Corner – Specialised Volunteer	Manage AV / lead exercise / order and manage supplies / manage volunteer and breakfast roster / organise special events and activities.
Seniors Corner – Ad hoc Volunteer	Supply breakfast; or if you are in a specialised profession, e.g. medical or health professionals, you are welcome to give talks; or have skills in areas of interest to seniors, you can conduct classes, e.g. craft and digital skills.
Seniors Corner – Facilitator for Alpha and Bible lessons	Help in group discussions and prayer, teach Bible lessons.

Seniors Fellowship – Organiser	Help out with programme planning and organising, event logistics (e.g. F&B, registration, AV)
Hangout with the Seniors – Volunteer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On Sunday mornings, lay out items at table, put extra chairs, and pack up after hangout • Engage the seniors and pray with them if needed • Supply snacks occasionally

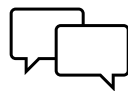

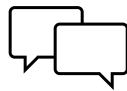

Futsal Fellowship

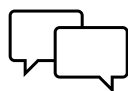

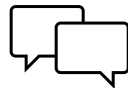

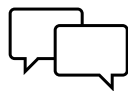
About Worship & Music Ministry

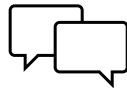

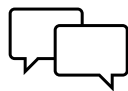
